EDIBLE FOOD RECOVERY & DONATION REQUIREMENTS

TIER ONE COMMERCIAL ENTITIES:

- Supermarkets
- Grocery stores >10,000 sq. ft.
- Food service providers (contracted)
- Food distributors
- Wholesale food vendors

TIER TWO - COMMERCIAL ENTITIES:

- Restaurants with 250 or more seats, or >5,000 sq. ft.
- Hotels with on-site food facility and >200 rooms.
- Health facilities with on-site food facility and >100 beds.
- Large venues that annually seat or serve an average of >2000 individuals per day of operation.
- Large events that serve an average over >2000 individuals per day of operation.
- State agencies with a cafeteria with >250 seats, or a total cafeteria facility size >5000 sq. ft.
- Local education agencies with an on-site food facility.

California state law SB 1383 requires "Tier One" and "Tier Two" Commercial Edible Food Generators to:

- 1. Donate the maximum amount of excess edible food to feed people.
- A contract or written agreement must be maintained with food recovery service(s) or organization(s) to pick up or receive edible food.
- 3. A record must also be kept indicating:
 - o the types of food being donated.
 - o pounds donated per month.
 - frequency of donations.
 - contact information of the contracted food recovery service(s) and/or organization(s).
- 4. Generators shall not intentionally spoil food that can be recovered.

Food Recovery Organization reporting requirements:

- 1. Maintain records of contracts with each tier one/tier two generator.
- 2. Maintain records of food received from each tier one/tier two generator.
- 3. Report total quantity in pounds of edible food collected from each commercial edible food generator per month.
- 4. Report total quantity in pounds of edible food transported to each food recovery organization per month.
- 5. The name, address and contact information for each food recovery organization that the service transports edible food to for food recovery.
 - Agency Partners of SLO Food Bank to follow program reporting procedures.
 - All other Food Recovery Organizations to register with us and report total pounds collected each calendar month to IWMA staff.
